JACKET · ABOUT BERLIN CHILLY Design 15 from About Berlin Special 02



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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 450 (500, 550) g of Lana Grossa **About Berlin Chilly** (100% linen; 95 m/50 g) in Natural (col 1). Size 7 mm needles; size 7 mm circular needle, 100 cm long.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

Front band patt: <u>Row 1 (RS)</u>: Knit all sts. <u>Row 2 (WS)</u>: * P1, M1R; rep from *, end p1. <u>Row 3 (RS)</u>: * SI 1 pwise wyib, p1; rep from *, end sI 1 pwise wyib. <u>Row 4 (WS)</u>: * P1, k1; rep from *, end p1. Work rows 1 – 4 once, then rep rows 3 and 4.

Rev St st: P on RS, k on WS.

2 selvage sts: <u>At beg of RS row</u>, k1, sl 1 pwise wyib; <u>at end</u> <u>of RS row</u>, work to last 2 sts, sl 1 pwise wyib, k1. <u>At beg of</u> <u>WS row</u>, sl 1 pwise wyif, p1; <u>at end of WS row</u>, work to last 2 sts, p1, sl 1 pwise wyif.

Gauge: 15 sts and 22 rows = 10 x 10 cm in rev St st on size 7 mm needles.

Jacket is worked in one piece: With size 7 mm circular needle cast on 225 (237, 249) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, p1, * k1, p1; rep from *, end selvage st. Cont in rib patt as

established for 2 more rows. Working 2 selvage sts at each edge, work in rev St st until piece meas 33 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Bind off 53 (56, 59) sts at beg of next 2 rows = 119 (125, 131) sts. Reestablish 2 selvage sts at each edge and cont in rev St st for 35 (37, 39) cm. Bind off all sts.

Pockets: Make 2 alike. With size 7 mm needles cast on 25 sts. Working 2 selvage sts at each edge, work in rev St st until piece meas 12 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): 2 selvage sts, p1, * k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2 selvage sts. Maintaining selvage sts, cont in rib patt as established for 2 more rows. Bind off all sts in rib.

Front and neckband: With size 7 mm needles cast on 7 sts. Work front band patt for 146 (150, 154) cm. Next row (RS): K2tog 6 times, k1 and at same time, bind off all sts = 7 bound-off sts.


Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Matching ^o to ^o, fold sides in towards center, matching * to *, fold top corners down [see diagram A]. Sewing between the 2 selvage sts, sew horizontal seams, leaving 16 cm open for arm openings [see diagram B]. Sew front and neckband to back neck and to left and right front edge [see diagram C]. Sew pockets to fronts.

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




Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
