

Design 12 from Filati Classici 15

PULLOVER · SLOW WOOL CANAPA

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 550 (600, 650) g of Lana Grossa Slow Wool Canapa (90% superwash Merino wool, 10% hemp; 100 m/50 g) in Light Grey (col 6). Size 6 mm needles; size 5 and 6 mm circular needles, each 40 cm long.

2x1 rib: K2, p1.

2x2 rib: P2, k2.

Body patt: Multiple of 2 + 1 + 2 selvage sts. Rows 1 and 2: K all sts. Row 3: Selvage st, * k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, selvage st. Row 4: Work sts as they appear. Rows 5 - 7: K all sts. Row 8: P all sts. Rep rows 1 - 8.

Gauge: 16 sts and 22 rows = 10×10 cm in body patt on size 6 mm needles, stretched lengthwise.


Back: With size 6 mm needles cast on 105 (111, 117) sts. Work body patt until piece meas 37 (38, 39) cm from caston, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge, bind off 1 st once, then 1 st 6 times, 2 sts 13 times (then 1 st 3 times, 2 sts 16 times / then 2 sts 19 times). Bind off rem 39

Front: Work same as for back until piece meas 50 (51, 52) cm from caston. Shape neck: Next RS row: Bind off center 25 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 3 sts at each neck edge once, 2 sts once, 1 st twice. No sts rem.

Sleeves: Sew shoulder seams. Sleeves are worked from the top down. Place

markers 23 (24, 25) cm down from shoulders on front and back. With size 6 mm needles and RS facing pick up and k 75 (79, 83) sts between markers. Work body patt for 77 rows, ending with a patt row 5. Bind off all sts in patt on next = patt row 6. Sleeve meas approx. 35.5 cm from pick-up row.

Finishing: Pin piece to measurements and block. Sew side and sleeve seams. Collar: With size 5 mm circular needle pick up and k 90 sts evenly around neck edge. Join for working in rnds. Work 2x1 rib for 6 cm. Next inc rnd: * K2, p1, k2, p1f&b; rep from * around = 105 sts. Next rnd: * K2, p1, k2, p2; rep from * around. Rep last rnd 5 more times. Next inc rnd: * K2, p1f&b, k2, p2; rep from * around = 120 sts. Change to size 6 mm circular needle. Work 2x2 rib until collar meas 26 cm from beg. Bind off all sts in rib.






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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
